### Chiefs' Report March 12, 2020

Here is a list of the projects and calls that have occurred over the last month:

2 major 911 calls:

1. A GSW that occurred in our district with a response from our Volunteers. They did an outstanding job in a difficult situation: Loyd Ogan did a CISM interview with two of the Volunteers and a follow up. There are no issues and both are doing fine.
2. A stroke call that resulted in an Air ambulance ride. On Monday the patient walked into Station 75 with no apparent issues. He and his family wanted to personally thank Chris Dillender, Devin Hern for the excellent care and to Ryan Purvis and Jeff Schwegler and Johnny Valenzuela for coming by his home to bring in firewood. The family could not say thank you enough. I am very proud of our Volunteers and paid staff and their care for our community.
3. The 50/50 Calfire wildland grant purchase is in progress and Kevin Trent with Cascade fire will be out to measure for Wildland gear and turnouts, March 18, 2020 at 1700 hours.
4. A yearly inventory is underway with FF Brian Morris taking care of this task with a due date of March 31, 2020.
5. Old panther Breathing apparatus is being picked up this Friday March 6<sup>th</sup>, 2020.
6. Evan Alexander will be signing his contract.
7. Still working on the applications for the CSFA grant, physical forms are still coming.
8. Locking interior doors were changed out on 3/4/2020.

9. All the fire extinguishers in the station, on apparatus and at the fuel pump have been serviced. One Class D was not serviced cost \$ 500.
10. Pest control did an inspection of the attic and found that the problem was squirrels and he could not take care of them and will send contact information of a company who could remove them.
11. Staff has been working on SOG's and hose loads, the front bumper lines were changed to the murphy load, the rear 2 ½ attack line and the 1 ¾ line were also done, all Volunteers and paid staff were trained before they were put into service.
12. The Support and Utility 75 were repaired.
13. Trent repaired lawn mower 75.
