El Dorado County to Perform Road Work Mosquito Road Bridge Replacement Road Closure from July 5, 2022 through August 8, 2022

June 21, 2022

(**PLACERVILLE, CA**) -- El Dorado County's Department of Transportation (DOT) will be performing road work on Mosquito Road from 0.6 miles north to 0.8 miles south of the Mosquito Road Bridge for tree removal, bridge maintenance, and north roadway tie-in work. The work requiring road closure within these limits is anticipated to begin July 5, 2022 and continue through August 8, 2022. The construction work will require full closure of Mosquito Road. A detour has been established via Rock Creek Road for which motorists should expect delays and allow extra time for travel.

The closure is necessary to ensure motorist and worker safety while the County's Contractor removes trees on the north limits of the Project and performs roadway realignment for the north roadway tie-in. The County DOT Bridge Crew will also be performing bridge maintenance work on the Mosquito Bridge while the roadway is closed. The full closure work from July 5, 2022 through August 8, 2022 is scheduled while school is out of session. Extension of this timeframe may be needed once the Project schedule is updated. Further notification will be provided at least two (2) weeks in advance if extension of the August 8, 2022 closure is required.

On the week of June 27, 2022, tree removal will also commence on the south Project limits, which will not require road closure. Mobilization of tree removal equipment will occur with pilot vehicles. The traveling public is advised to reduce speeds, watch for pilot vehicles, and allow extra time for travel. Every effort will be made by the County's Contractor to minimize public impact during the tree removal work on the week of June 27, 2022.

The County sincerely appreciates the cooperation and patience of motorists that use this roadway and we apologize for any inconvenience as a result of these closures.
