# PSPS Event Weather Overview

PG&E meteorologists are closely monitoring the potential for dry and gusty north winds starting Monday morning.

- A weather system will drop into Nevada Sunday night through Tuesday bringing periods of gusty winds and dry conditions to the region Monday morning through Tuesday. Northerly winds will increase Sunday night into Monday morning for the northern Sacramento Valley and foothills, before spreading down the Sacramento Valley and San Joaquin Valley during the daytime hours of Monday. Expect sustained winds 15-30 mph, with peak gusts 35-50 mph across the Sacramento and San Joaquin Valleys, surrounding foothills, and Bay Area hills on Monday. Relative humidity values will drop to 10-15% by Monday afternoon across most of the region. North to northeast winds will continue for the western Sacramento Valley, western San Joaquin Valley, and the Sierra through Tuesday afternoon. The National Weather Service has issued Fire Weather Watches in advance of the event for Monday and Tuesday.

## DEFINITIONS

- **Microgrids:** A small portion of the electric grid that is isolated from the larger electric grid and powered via backup generators located at a substation or other pre-determined site
- **Islanding:** Local generation sources are reconfigured to allow certain areas to be separated from the larger electric grid and remain energized
- **Ad-Hoc Backup Power:** Backup generation deployed to critical facilities (e.g., emergency hospitals)
- **In-Event Switching:** Electricity is rerouted through a safe-to-energize distribution line to avoid PSPS related outages
- **Permanent Energy Generation:** Generators permanently installed and connected to overhead lines that run through Tier 2 and 3 High Fire-Threat Districts. This generation is only used when it is not within the PSPS weather footprint.
